IGIC Website Ideas – Josh McNary & Nikki Breitsprecker

Discussion was held regarding the revamping of the IGIC website. It is felt the current site is not user-friendly or welcoming to visitors. It was decided that webinar training was necessary and Nikki and Josh will experiment with changing the theme and skins. There needs to be more participation from IGIC Board members related to the website.

CAP Grant Re-cap – Jim Giglierano

Jim mentioned a bill that is currently working its way through the legislature that involves planning and mentions the creation of a GIS. No action is necessary on this; this is just FYI.



LiDAR Update – products include 2-foot contours state-wide, 1 m hillshade, and a 3-meter DEM. This data is not yet on the DNR GIS library website. Jim is hoping to have a "kick-off" to promote the data and IGI this summer.

A 2010 4-band NAIP project looks likely to happen. The project is still looking for contributions to the project – if your entity can contribute, please let Jim know – any amount is welcome. No action was taken but the general consensus is that if there are funds available, then the IGIC will support the project with about \$2,000. An email vote will be forthcoming for the IGIC Board.

USGS – The National Map and Viewer – Bob Lemen

There was a 125yh USGS Anniversary celebration in December 2009. The event served as a kick-off to the new topomaps and The National Map. The digital product is a GeoPDF. Base information includes NAIP imagery, roads, names, and grid. Contours and hydrography will be added next, with eventual inclusion of boundaries, land cover, and structures. The goal is to update these maps on a 3-year cycle.

The USGS is currently scanning all paper products from the past. These will eventually be linked to the current quadrangle map.

A new National Map Viewer is currently in beta testing. This viewer will replace several existing map viewers. To learn more about the National Map project, please visit http://nationalmap.gov/uptopo.faq.html.

New Business

Crowdsourcing Project – Jim had an idea based on a Google Model Your Town competition. It would be an educational opportunity where 20 or so GIS professionals descend upon a town and GPS local assets on a weekend, then present the information to interested parties and citizens that afternoon. This information would be updated to Google. It was also suggested to make the event more of a community geo-caching event. No decisions were made at this time.

Sector Representation — There have been several changes — Herb Kuehne has resigned. Anne Packard is no longer with Howard R Green, and Scott Ermer is no longer in the field of GIS. Elections will be this summer so there will be no official changes for now. A slate of candidates will be presented at the next IGIC Quarterly meeting.

MAGIC (Mid-America GIS Consortium)

The Conference will be held April 18-22 in Kansas City, MO. MAGIC is offering each state \$1,000 to assist members in attending the MAGIC Symposium. This would be for travel expenses, registration, etc. Any interested people should contact Brad Cutler or Paula Lemke.

There will be a Senior Executive meeting at MAGIC for CIO-type professionals. There are several people from Iowa attending this year's event.



Sector Reports – Bob Lemen said the USGS is looking to reduce the number of state liaisons with the USGS. The IGIC Board is going to write a "letter of information" to summarize how this program has resulted in significant contributions to statewide projects from the USGS. The letter may be presented to representatives of the US Congress.

Paula brought up a LiDAR webinar to be held on February 24, relating LiDAR and Pictometry.

Set Next Meeting Date & Location — The group discussed procedures for canceling/postponing/rescheduling future quarterly meetings. Dave will make sure the agenda is out several weeks before the meeting, and once agenda is finalized, no changes will be allowed until the day of the meeting. Several board members will experiment with different webinar options to allow those unable to make the meetings the opportunity to participate remotely.

The next IGIC Board Meeting will be held Wednesday, April 28 at the Johnston Public Library in Johnston, IA

 FYI - Rebuild Iowa Office - Smart Planning Initiative - Three parts: smart planning definitions, city and county comprehensive planning, smart planning task force (includes a GIS item). Passed out of RIO committee as Senate File 2265.

- 2) Grant Progress
 - a. Finished 2008 CAP grant structures and transportation data will be available on new IGI ftp site by the end of February (address will be something like igi-ftp.gis.iastate.edu).
 - b. Submitted 2010 CAP grant for CAP Category 5, Return on Investment Methodology and Business Case Development for multi-agency NSDI projects. Title of proposal: A return on investment cast study of Iowa One Map: a Public-Private Partnership for the shared development of the Iowa Geospatial Infrastructure. \$50k, waiting from rejection or confirmation
 - ARRA Grant Application \$300k for orthoimagery assistance, submitted last November not funded by USGS
 - d. Highway Research Board idea for county culvert and bridge database partners might include IGIC, ICIT, county engineers and service bureau – data collection, online database, training with lidar products – March 5 deadline for topics
- 3) The Geocoding Project
 - a. Address point pilot project with 3 counties done Story, Decatur and Osceola
 - b. New counties started Pottawattamie, Warren, Emmet and Cherokee
 - Will work with others to complete address points for 25 counties by the end of summer need partners
 - d. Having difficulty producing decent looking building footprints from lidar still working on it
 - e. Student doing data inventory of county data orthos, road centerlines with address ranges, address points, structures, parcels using http://ia.gisinventory.net/ to store results
- 4) Lidar project
 - a. Still waiting for bulk of data from spring 2009 flights any day now
 - b. Spring 2010 may be last chance to complete the state
 - c. Developed derivative products for counties: 2 ft contours, hill shades, 3 meter DEMs. (Adams, Allamakee, Appanoose, Buchanan, Clarke, Davis, Decature, Iowa, Jasper, Jefferson, Keokuk, Lucas, Lyon, Mahaska, Marion, Monroe, OBrien, Osceola, Page, Polk, Poweshiek, Ringgold, Sioux, Story, Taylor, Union, Wapello, Warren, Wayne, Winneshiek. Cass, Fremont, Boone, and Marshall in the works)
 - d. Developing a stream centerline file from lidar, using 3m DEM for 10-digit HUCs. Part of floodplain mapping activities.
- NAIP 2010 will be flown by USDA. DNR trying to organize local share for 4-band buy-up. Need \$91k total from lowa partners.
- Crowd-sourcing project just an idea for a GIS educational event
 - a. Pick an area or topic that is not well mapped
 - b. Pick a date to do mapping spring 2010? A Saturday?
 - c. Get various groups to participate local, university, IGIC, others maybe 25 to 50 people?
 - d. Get GPS units, cameras, other paraphernalia for mapping
 - e. Do mapping in the morning, upload to Internet in the afternoon Google Maps?
