Welcome and Opening

Greg Jameson called the meeting to order at 10:03 am. General introductions and roll call.

Approve Agenda

The agenda was amended to move Penny Vossler from county government to at large.

Debbie Stevens made a motion to approve the meeting agenda and it was seconded by Penny Vossler. All members present voted aye.

Treasurer's Report

Josh Obrecht gave a Treasurer's Report. All site licenses have money has been received, a renewal fee for Quicken was paid, as was website support (approved last meeting). The current balance as of 10/19/2023 is \$32,094.89. Taxes should be done in next week or two. There are no big items coming up.

Discussion on Indian Hills curriculum

Debbie Stevens requested feedback on the Indian Hills curriculum and skill sets being taught. Information had been sent out prior to the meeting and, with approval from the Indian Hills advisory board, input was sought as to what products should be taught. They are using Survey123, getting more into field maps and quick capture, but wonder what they are missing for the associates' program?

Brad Cutler said the list shared appeared to be a robust list, as it included: ArcGis Online, as well as Desktop with ArcPro. There was some discussion regarding the need to still teach ArcMap, since some counties and organizations are still using it, but our site license will not support ArcMap next year. There was a suggestion to include more castadral work. Also, since the site license gives access to Enterprise, they might want to explore teaching publishing and maintaining data on it. There may also be a need to consider the role of AI in the future. A discussion about the use of handheld GPS units revealed that many entities still use them, but a greater focus should be just how to collect data inside Field Maps. Debbie asks for other suggestions to be emailed to her.

Updates from committees and representatives

Education Committee Report

Robin McNeely will be retiring at the end of the year and will needs someone to take on her role on Education Committee. Currently she focuses on internal member focused education, and outreach events for cities or organizations, Amy Logan and Debbie Stevens have been working on training teachers and students.

Debbie and Amy offered a K-12 teacher training recently with 5 teachers attending. They taught the teachers about different resources with the end goal to build a story map. Teachers can then know how to use story maps and hopefully have students join Iowa Map contest.

Information on the next map contest is getting ready to out. T3G sent out a call to recruit more teachers and students into the program. In November, Debbie will send out more information for teachers.

An Earth Observation Day event was held last week, with a lot of turnout from IGIC, including lots of IGIC speakers.

ITAG Venue Planning

Report by Niccole Schippers: The contract has been signed by ICIT and ITAG. The location is Prairie Meadows for the next 4 years. 2024 will be the last year at the Sheraton. Greg and Niccole will chair the conference in 2025, as it will be IGIC's year to chair the conference.

911 Liaison

The 911 council is on the governor's list to eliminate. Other than that, they are just working on a couple of minor issues, including transferring calls from cells phones in Iowa that route to out of state towers and some funds for training. Further clarification will come in the next meeting.

State of Iowa updates

Report by Patrick Wilke Brown: They are getting ready to announce \$150 million dollar grants for broadband. The next focus will be BEAD, and there may be some opportunities, particularly for county folks to get information about the application process.

Patrick recently returned from the National GIC. The main focus was on web accessibility and guidelines, especially accessibility guideline requirements, which are important to entities publishing information. Information how to design for better accessibility can be found at:
